

CLARIFICATION OF REQUIREMENTS OF RULE .0504(6)

Rule .0504(6) of the Rules Governing the Admission to Practice Law in North Carolina provides:

“As a prerequisite to being licensed by the Board to practice law in the State of North Carolina, a transfer applicant shall:

...

“have within the three-year period preceding the filing date of the application, taken the Uniform Bar Examination and achieved a scaled score on such exam that is equal to or greater than the passing score established by the Board for the UBE as of the administration of the exam immediately preceding the filing date;”

For purposes of this rule: (1) “passing score” means the minimum passing score established by the Board for the UBE as of the administration date of the exam immediately preceding the filing date; and (2) the three-year period preceding the filing date will begin to run the date the applicant actually sat for the Uniform Bar Examination, not the date the applicant received their results or was licensed by any jurisdiction.
